

Description

What do films set in ancient Greece tell us about our identities now? This course explores the relationship modern artists have constructed with ancient Greece in films. The main focus will be on how contemporary Americans view, depict, and change ancient experiences based on differing circumstances of time and place. Topics for discussion include the distinction between "myth" and "history", the depiction of gender, the representation of the divine, considerations of the audience, and the mechanics of adaptation.
